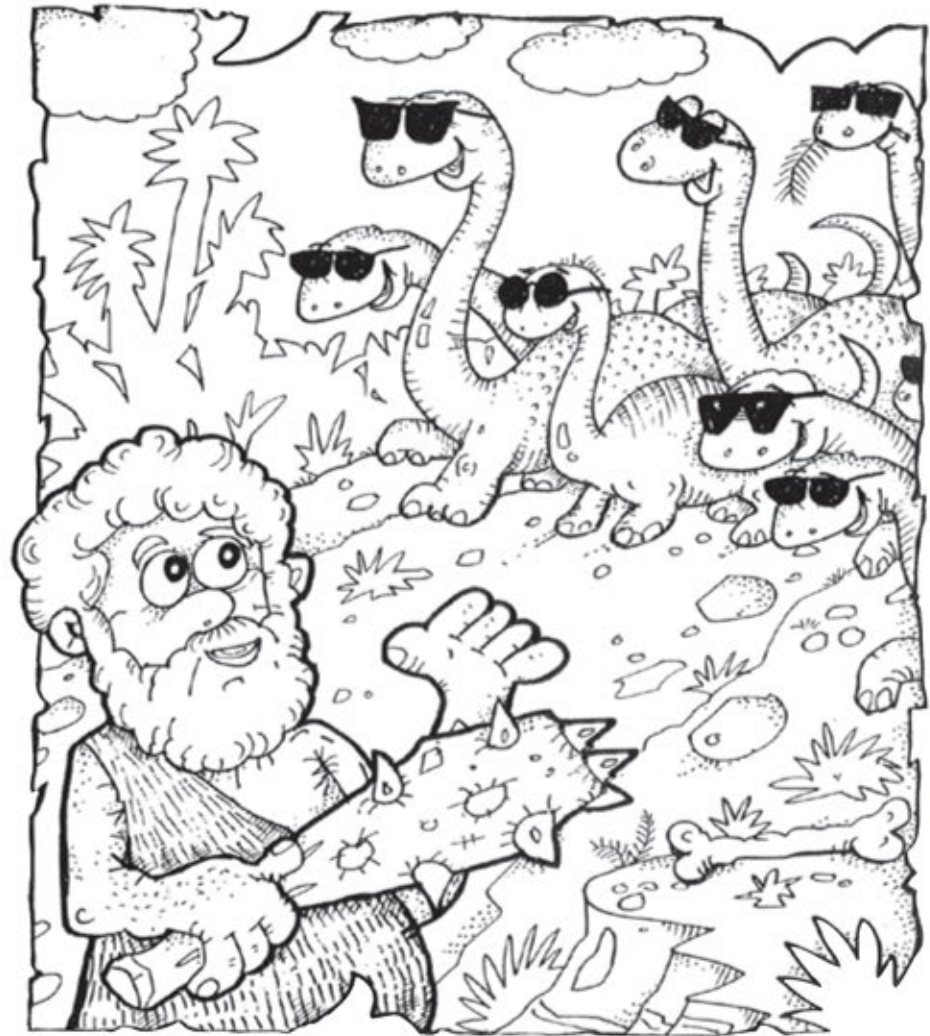
Did you know? The head of a tyrannosaurus could have been over 1.5 metres long. Its jaws were lined with sharp teeth the size of a large kitchen knife.

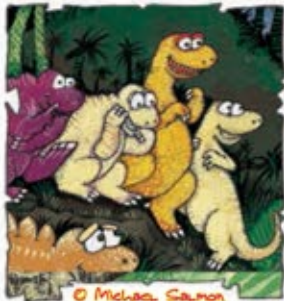

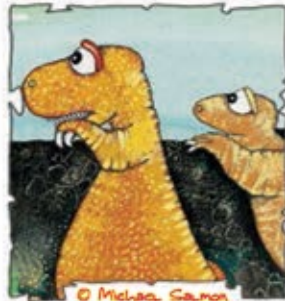

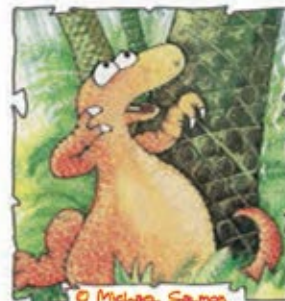
